#### **Programme**

#### **Day 1:**

The meeting starts with the welcome speech by the host representatives of the City of Kętrzy emphasizes gratitude for attendees and highlights the city's rich history, culture, and community spirit. It invites guests to explore the city's attractions and engage with its diverse population while fostering a spirit of collaboration and unity for a brighter future. The participated representatives from city council presented their cities.

The seminar "Let's Change Europe" with experts and policy makers aimed to discuss and propose ideas for positive and green transformation within Europe. It likely addresses various aspects such as politics, economy, social issues, and culture, with the goal of inspiring change and improvement across the continent. Participants shared insights, engage in dialogue, and develop strategies to address challenges and seize opportunities for progress in Europe.

The meeting with the young generation and staff in a school, attended by international representatives from city councils, aimed to foster dialogue, exchange ideas and collaboration between local youth and international participants. Through interactive discussions and activities, the meeting seeks to empower young people, promote civic engagement, and encourage meaningful contributions to shaping the future of their cities and beyond.

The visit to the Wolf's Lair in Gierłoż offered a profound historical perspective with relevance to contemporary Europe. This site, once a key military headquarters for Nazi Germany during World War II, serves as a poignant reminder of the atrocities of the past and the importance of preserving peace and unity in today's Europe. Exploring the ruins and learning about the events that transpired here provides valuable insights into the consequences of unchecked power and the resilience of nations in the face of tyranny.
